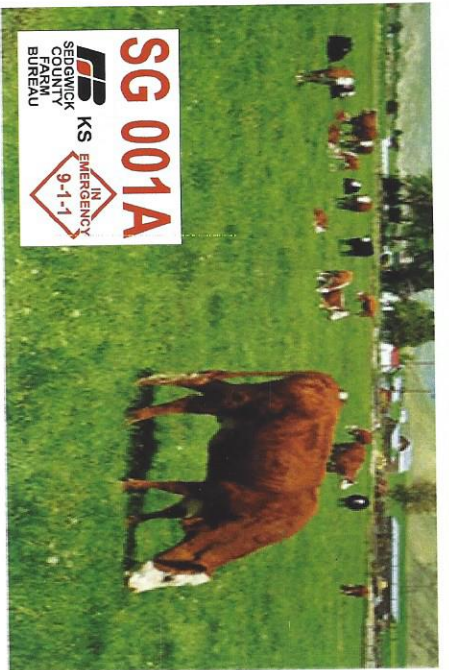

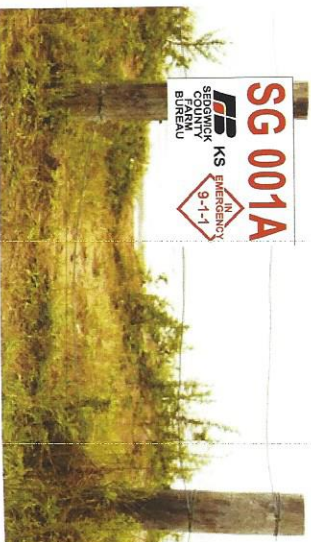

An efficient means of identifying owners of strayed livestock

The Program

Animals that stray from pastures can present a safety issue for both the general public and the animals.

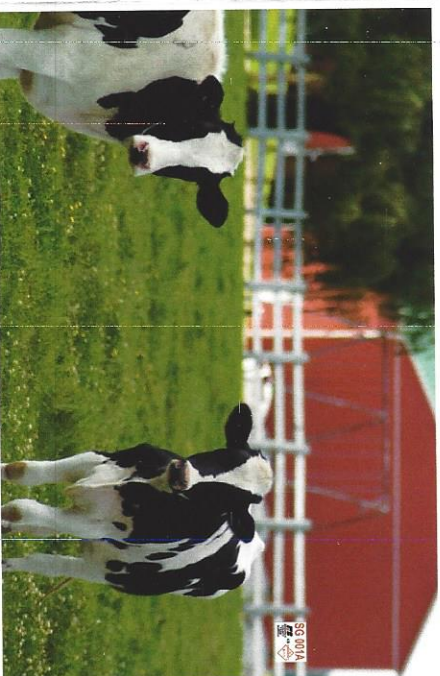
The Pasture Labeling program, launched by Barton County Farm Bureau provides an efficient means of identifying owners of strayed livestock.

This joint effort of the Sedgwick County Farm Bureau and the Sedgwick County Sheriff's Office provides producer identification and allows direct communication between 911 and the producer should their livestock stray from a fenced pasture.

The system can work for all types of livestock, including cattle, horses, sheep, goats, mules, llamas, ostrich, emus, etc.

How Does the System Work?

1. The county Farm Bureau and local law enforcement agree to partner in this long-term project. The county Farm Bureau collects data provided by participating producers and it is entered into a database. Information is confidential and provided to 911 emergency service.
2. If livestock stray from a labeled pasture, law enforcement and passersby can contact 911 and relay the identification number listed on the producers posted sign.
3. 911 quickly identifies the identification number and contacts the livestock owner.



Program Features

- Farm Bureau members can sign up free of charge. Non-members can also participate for a **\$50** sign-up fee.
- List up to **5** Emergency Contact Numbers
- Those registering in the program receive **2** transportable reflective metal signs featuring the producer's unique tracking number.
- Additional signs may be purchased at cost.

Program Benefits

- Identifies animals and provides faster communication between 911 and livestock owner
- Public safety
- Deters theft
- Reduces owner liability risk
- Reduces workload for deputies
